## On the difference between limit and control

Control imposes order from without by projecting the predetermined thought, conditioned by the past, of what should happen. The need to control invariably increases as the disorderly, unexpected, side-effects of past efforts accumulate, which results in ever-greater unnecessary difficulties or complicatedness; In contrast, limit allows order to emerge from within by determining only what at any given moment should not happen. Limit is therefore open to the future and tends strongly towards ever-greater simplicity.
